Born at Tripoli Ia. Feb. 10 1894. Was a son of August and Mary Bockhaus.
Graduated from High School at Tripoli in class of 1913. Attended Waterloo
College of Commerce and afterward worked for a firm in Cedar Rapids, Ia.
For three years was a bookkeeper in Tripoli. In the fall of 1917 he
became a store manager at Ackley Ia.

From here he enlisted for service and a few days later was called to
Jefferson Barracks Mo.

He was survived by his mother, a twin sister Alberta, a sister Mrs. L.M.
Feldeemann, as well as two brothers Herman and Henry. The father died
at Ashley N. D. Feb. 16, 1906.

Albert belonged to the Modern Woodman and was buried by then in Fremont
Cemetery at Tripoli, Iowa.
