At the dance following the

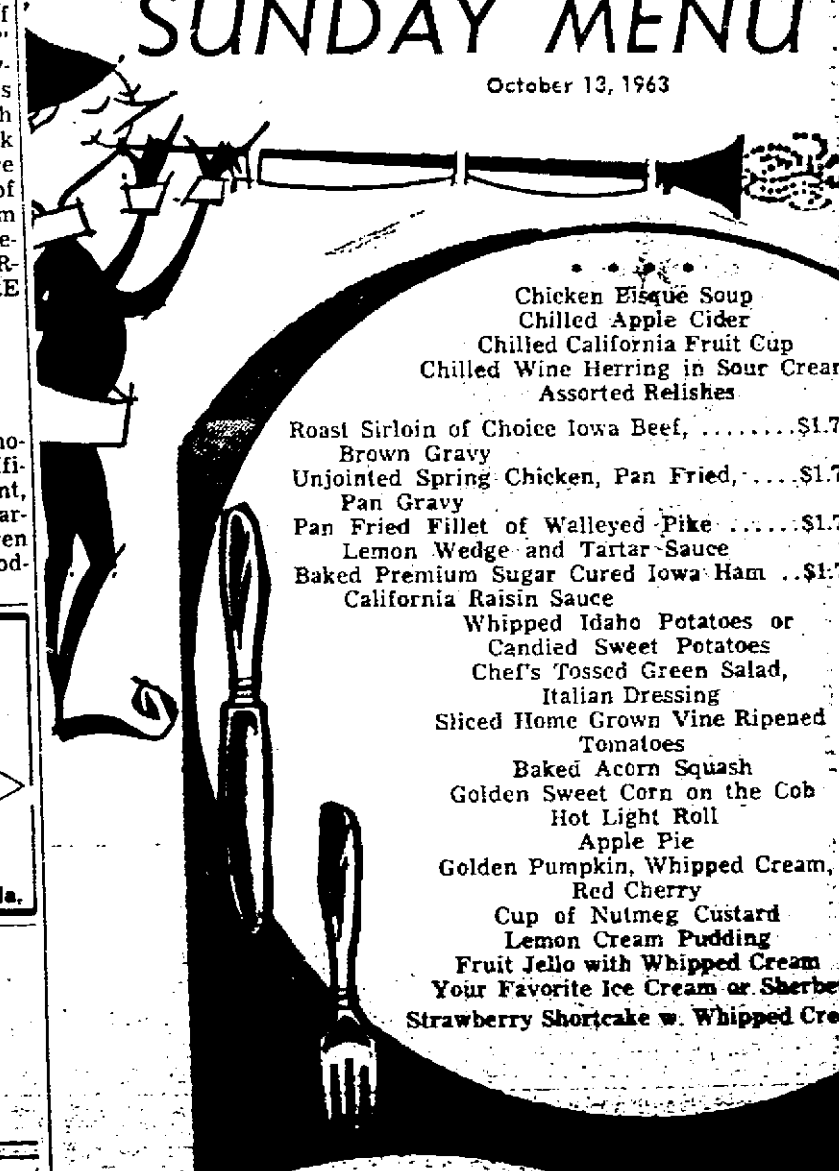
