

Fine 19 Boys In Beer Case

(Courier News Bureau) CEDAR FALLS — Nineteen teenagers charged with illegally buying beer were fined \$25 plus \$4.50 costs in municipal court here Thursday afternoon.

Five of the 19 had pleaded guilty a week ago to charges of securing beer while being minors. The remaining 14 pleaded guilty to the same charges Thursday afternoon.

POLICE investigation reports that beer would be sold at the Cedar Falls High School prom led to the arrests. Most of the beer bought by the 19 was stolen from a freight car in Waterloo last month. Two 17-year-old Cedar Falls high students were arrested for the theft of the beer.

They were Ronnie A. Boyesen, 17, Rt. 3, and Richard A. Olsson, 623 W. 6th St. Boyesen was charged with larceny and waived preliminary hearing Thursday in Waterloo municipal court. His bond was set at \$1,000.

Olsson was turned over to juvenile authorities. They said that Boyesen had a previous juvenile record, while Olsson did not.

SOME of the beer was sold before the prom and some of it was sold at the dance. Before the 19 were sentenced Thursday afternoon, Assistant County Attorney Bill Mermer complimented the youths for their "cooperation and truthfulness." Detective Capt. Earl Immer, also remarked that he was pleased with the cooperation in the case.

Municipal Court Judge Forest Eastman said the 19 had "knowingly put yourselves and others in a dangerous situation" by acquiring the beer. He made references to other incidents in which student drinking at proms had been a factor in fatal auto accidents.

Sinus Block Dies at 89

(Courier News Bureau) Cedar Falls, Iowa, died at 89 Monday of complications incident to advanced age.

He came to Waterloo in 1931 and established the Block funeral home at that time. Mr. Block had followed the funeral profession since 1905. He became a member of the Iowa Funeral Directors' association in 1906. From 1905 until 1928 he was the owner of a funeral home at Parkersburg. For three years he operated a funeral home in Appleton, Ia., and then came to Waterloo.

He was born on Oct. 4, 1872 at Wymere, Germany, the son of Rudolph J. and Schwanje Sinning Block. Mr. Block came to the United States in 1884 and settled in Hardin county.

He married Tena Kruse in 1897. Three children were born to them, Rudolph S. Block, 415 E. Park Ave.; Ruth Block Deitel of Lacomada, Calif.; Ann Meeker of Talent, Ore.; three grandchildren and eight great grandchildren, all of whom survive.

His first wife died in 1934. He married Christine Williams in 1935, and she survives. Funeral services will be at 1:30 p. m. Saturday at the Kistner funeral home. Paul Elliott and Leonard DeBhur, will have charge of the services. Burial will be in Oak Hill cemetery, Parkersburg.
