He died in Camp while Naval Guard was at encampment was recommended for Lieutenancy but died a couple of days before the commission arrived. He served five years in the 53rd Inf. Ia. Nat. Guard. One year as a Pvt. 4 yrs. as Cpl, 2 yrs. detailed to Regular Com. Dept. and 1 year as Com. Sgt. 1st Ia. N.G. In Colo. N.G. he served as regimental Sgt. Major of 1st Colo. Inf. and was recorded for Lieut., but as stated died before his commission arrived. He enlisted April 1905, in Corp Co. B 53 Ia. Ing. N.G. and reenlisted same April 24, 1908. Com. Sgt. 1st Ia. N.G. Color. July 19, 1910. made regimental Sgt. Major.
