Charles O. Henninger 28 years old aviation ordnanceman 3rd. class was killed on Dec. 13 1945 in a Navy Plane Crash, 8 miles northwest of Charlestown R.I.

Had served in the navy Air Corps since March 1944 and was stationed at Quowset Point R.I.

He was born Sept. 24, 1917 at Jasper Ind. a son of Andrew and Maggie Negginger. In april 1939 he married Geneva Holms at Dubuque Ia. He was a member of St. Peter's Evangelical and Reformed church at Tripoli, Ia. He is survived by his wife and son Ronald. Charles was scheduled routine flight as combat Aircrewman in a navy plane on Dec. 13, 1945 from the U.S. Naval Air Station Quowset Point R.I.
