Born in Clarion Co. Pa. Sept 22 1838. He came to Fayette Co Ia when young and his schooling was taken in the Upper Ia Uni. at Fayette Ia. He enlisted in 1861 in Co. C. 12 Ia Inf and served until Dec. 1864 having been a prisoner for 7 months in those terrible prisons Libbey and Andersonville which broke his health and for several months his life was despaired of. He was married on May 11 1871 to Mary Bursh of Waverly by Rev. R. L. Parsons and lived for several years in Fayette before coming to Waverly to live about 1885. To them were born 7 children 5 who with the widow survived him. He was a member of the M. E. Church at Waverly. He was a post commander of the GA^R Post of Waverly His death was caused by blood poison from a scratch and death came with a very few days from streptocottic infection
