He was married Nov. 3. 1872 to Elizabeth Gishbert. Promoted to 4 Corp 11-29-1863, re-enlisted 1-4-1864, made 3 Corp 7-1-64 and 2 corp 1-1-65, prom. to 2 sgt 5-1-65 and to 4 sgt 7-1-65.

One son Albert was in world war and deceased in Jan 1930, two other sons were deceased young (Edward and Aloysius)
