Born in Pa. his parents were natives of Maine moving to Boone Co. Ill. in 1839. Came to Iowa at an early age and enlisted from Sabulary Iowa.

Promoted to sergeant major. Feb. 24 1862 promoted to 1st Lt. of Co. G. August, 5 1863. He was wounded severely in the arm May 12 1864 at Resaca G

Came to Waverly at the close of the Civil War. It was he who went to Vicksburg after the war and brought back the body of his friend and Superior Officer Lt. Edw. Tyrrell to Waverly for burial. Foster was promoted the Lt. after the death of Tyrrell.

He married a Miss Doyle

To them were born sons Harry, Roy and daughters Mrs. Ralph Ellis of Waterloo and Florence deceased in 1926.

Roy died in Calif 8-13-1935 buried Shell Rock Iz he was born 10-5 1878. and married Olive Bobcock at Waverly Ia 6-7-1889 moves to Calif. 1916.
