Was a member of the Knights of Pythias.

For years Mr J was a demaker in horses and later ran a leverly in Waverly. At the time of enlistment he was a resident of Sumner.

His father was Capt. Jesse Jarvis of the U.S. regulars who served in the Civil War, and who died and is buried in Folfox Nebr.

They deopted a child of a relative who married a Mr. O'Bele. She died leaving a daughter Alva when the Jarvis family reased to maturity as their own thild.
