Born in Brookfield - Madison Co. N. Y. 5-20-1842 came to Elgin, Ill in 1859. Married at Elgin, Ill 3-5-1867 to Marish L. Aldrich - 6 children born to them - Mattie dying at Grand Rapids Wis on 5-25-1905. One first in Co. B. 36 Ill Inf and was in battle of Pea Ridge transferred to Army of Mississippi, then to the Army of the Cumberland. Was at Look Out Mt. at one time was an orderly to Gen. Thomas was with Sherman March to sea - was captured and spent 9 mon in Andersonville prison was released in 1864 then re-enlisted again in 1864 in Co. K 15 Ill Cav. serving to close of war. Came to a farm 3 miles west of Plainfield in 1871. He was a large man weighing about 380 lbs. Was state Senator on the Rep. ticket - a prominent Mason having joined the fraternity at Elgin, Ill before coming to Iowa. Member of the chapter and helped organize Grand Chapter in Waverly. Was charter member of Capt Wm. Folks Post Just of Peace, Co Supervisor, Cor coronor and prominent in Political circles for years. Electoral Deleg to the national convention from the 3rd district. Died from an illness of cancer on Mar. 8 1908 was survived by widow - 5 children - 3 brothers and 3 sister. Burial in old section of Willow Lawn cemetery at Plainfield by GAR and Masonic fraternities
