He and an older brother came to Sumner Bremer Co. Ia in 1857 as pioneers where Levi farmed 400 acres of Prairie land at the outbreak of the Civil war he returned to his N.Y. home where he enlisted. Took Part in 16 engagements wounded by gun shot--wounded in hand at UpperVille Va. Promoted to Corp after his discharge he came back to his Prairie farm in the late 1864.

In 1898 he sold this farm and for 2 years lived in Fayette county Ia. east of Sumner later bought a 40 acre farm in Sumner Twp. and farmed it until 1909 when he retired and lived in Sumner until his death. Because he was totally blind he lived with his son for a while. Was married at Independence Ia to Mary Fox who was a native of New Jersey Tip Munger as he was familiarly known was a great sportsman--he loved to hunt deer in Northern Minn. and would spend Winter months there with his friends.

His brother Harmon/Messenger lived died and was buried in Waverly Ia. another brother Albert P. Munger was a soldier of Co. C. 12 Ial Inf Civil War.

It is said that he took part in 38 battles. He was the last Bremer county survivor of the Battle of Gettysburg. Since there is no active G.A.R. Post in Sumner at this time--the funeral was honored by a deligation of the American Legion as escort.
