July 25, 1862 went first to Dubuque to enter south and a few months later became ill when so many of the company were sick by disease from southern swampy condition. In the spring he was sent north on a furlough to recuperate but died her near 5-1863. The second soldied to be burried in Horton Cemetery. The father died a few years afterwards and the old settlers seem to think Mrs. Taylor married again — no farther record as no relativeslive in county now.
