Born in NY Rochester 1845 ~~one~~ with his parents Mr and Mrs Nicholas Tyrell to McHenry Co. Ill in 1847 and to Bremer Co. Ia. in 1857 by vocation he was a store mason and while here worked in Bremer Co's first court house. Nicholas Tyrell was born in Iceland was made a mason in Iceland and was founder of Tyrell lodge 116 at Waverly Ia. John was a member here he went to Marenga Ia. where he enlisted as 1st Sgt. of Co. G. 28 Ia. Inf. at age of 34 years. Was wounded severely in battle, taken prisoner ex-changed reached his unit but his health was broken and he died of disease while Co. was at Augusta Ga. buried in Natl. Cemetery Ga but memorial was erected here at Waverly Ia. He had a nephew Frank Tyrell in service in Co. K. 3rd. Ia. Infl and a brother Lt. Edward Tyrell who as 1st. Lt. of Co. G. 9 Ia. was first officer killed as he led his men over the breast works at seigh of Vicksburg Miss. Ia. Roster of Co. 5 28 Ia. Col. Inf. listed his man as John Tyerrell. John is O.K. read above again the family always spell the name Tyrell the Roster gives wrong spelling.
