Was living in Waverly at time of enlistment and one of 18 boys to go to Cedar Falls and enlist the first unit to leave Bremer Co. and were not credited to this Co. in the records but given to Black Hawk Co. Was wounded in shoulder and arm at Shiloh, captured and for many months in Rebel prison and finally exchanged and went back to Co. dis in 1864. Born in Rochester NY helped build Welland Canal came to Bremer Co. Ia. 1853 married Myra Brown of Reno Kan and to them born a son who died young a daughter lives in Calif. Frank as he was called liked his brother Chas was an early day printer in Waverly moved to San Jose Calif where he died and buried at Waverly the wife died many years ago.
