Born in Lee. Co. Ill 1834 served 6 months and discharged because of wounds received at battle of Blue Mills landing 1861. Had 2 other enlistments.

Died in soldiers home at Marshalltown Ia. age 93 buried at Waverly Ia. by side of wife who preceeded him. She died at Plainfield at age of 59 on Nov. 15, 1905. He farmed in Bremer and Butler Ci until the wife died then came to Waverly to live with Daughter Jessie Frasher. He had 3 brothers Alfred John and Hirschell Wilcox in service in 3 Ia. Inf.

when his daughter Jessie died he went to the Soldiers home at Marshalltown Ia. where his death occurred
