Nine W-SR choir members were selected to perform with the All-State Chorus. They include Senior:

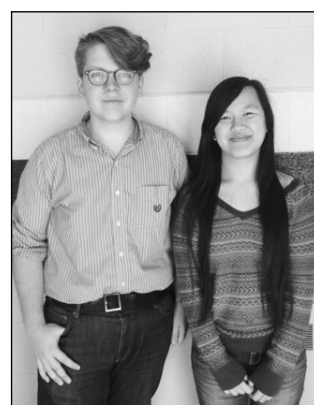

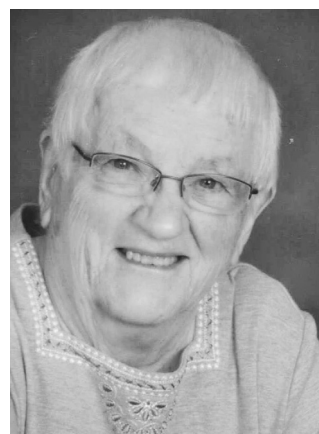
