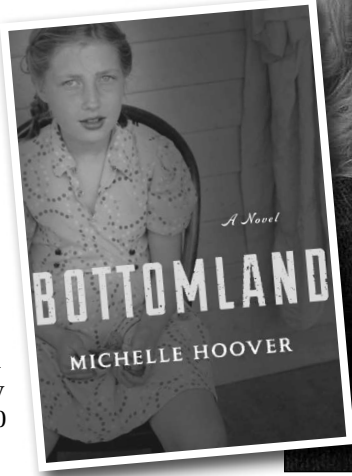
Waverly Public Library to host award-winning author Michelle Hoover Oct. 14

The Waverly Public Library will host award-winning author Michelle Hoover on Saturday, Oct. 14 at 3 p.m. Hoover, the author of the 2017 All Iowa Reads selection, *Bottomland*, will discuss her book and sign copies. Barnes & Noble booksellers will be on hand to sell Hoover's books after her presentation.

Based on a real life story of the author's grandmother, *Bottomland* follows the Hess family of Iowa in the years after World War I as they attempt to rid themselves of the Anti-German sentiment that left a stain on their name. When the youngest two daughters vanish in the middle of the night, the family must piece together what happened while struggling to maintain their life on the unforgiving Iowa plains. Ostracized, misunderstood, and increasingly isolated in their tightly-knit small town in the wake of the war, the Hesses fear the worst. Told in the voices of the family patriarch and his children, this is a haunting literary mystery that spans decades before its resolution. It was described in the Minneapolis Star Tribune as "a mystery wrapped in isolation and ethnic fear ... an atmospheric and engaging tale."

Michelle Hoover is the Fannie Hurst Writer-in-Residence at Brandeis University and teaches at GrubStreet, where she leads the Novel Incubator program. She is a 2014 NEA Fellow and has been a Writer-in-Residence at Bucknell University, a MacDowell Fellow, and a winner of the PEN/New England Discovery Award. Her debut, *The Quickening*, was a 2010 Massachusetts Book Award "Must Read."

She is a native of Iowa and lives in Boston.

Wartburg's Bach's Lunch to celebrate the Reformation



Wartburg College organist Karen Black will feature pieces based on Lutheran chorale tunes as a celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation during the college's Bach's Lunch organ recital series Oct. 13.

The concert will begin at 12:30 p.m. in Wartburg Chapel. It will be preceded by a noon lunch and conversation with Black

in the Chapel Commons. Pieces will include "Fantasy on Ein feste Burg ist unser Gott" by Pamela Decker, "Schmücke dich, o liebe Seele, BWV 654" by Johann Sebastian Bach and "Partita on Wacht auf, ruft uns die Stimme, Op. 8, No. 2" by Hugo Distler.

Black, the Rudi Inselmann Endowed Professor of Organ, teaches organ and church music, music theory and aural skills. She also serves as organist for weekday chapel and Sunday worship services and conducts the St. Elizabeth Chorale. Black is active as a recitalist and clinician and has performed throughout the United States and in Germany, including at the Castle Church in Wittenburg and St. George's Church in Eisenach.
